Notes for JAMES MCCULLOUGH:

James was the younger brother of John McCullough. He and John were captured by Indians in 1756 (see David F McCullough and handwritten account of his captivity. It is believed that James was killed after he and John were separated during their captivity at Fort Duquesne (now Pittsburgh)

2. JOHN² MCCULLOUGH (*JAMES*¹) was born 1749 in Newcastle, Delaware, and died 24 Jan 1823. He married (1) ELIZABETH CUNNINGHAM, daughter of SUSAN KING. She died 01 Dec 1828. He married (2) MARY MCKINNIE 08 Nov 1774. She died 15 Sep 1786.

Notes for JOHN MCCULLOUGH:

The famous John McCullough that was kidnapped by the Delaware Indians and a Frenchman during the start of the French and Indian War. See the copy of the handwritten manuscript that David F McCullough wrote and the history of the McCullough family written by John McCullough III

Notes for ELIZABETH CUNNINGHAM:

Killed by Indians near Bridgeport, now called Marks (see McCullough history)

Notes for DAVID FULLERTON MCCULLOUGH:

David F. McCullough wrote the handwritten account of John McCullough captivity. Ruth Thomson donated this to a colleague of hers that represented the Ohio Historical Society. The Thomson family only has possession of a photocopy of the original manuscript.

Notes for GEORGE HUGH THOMSON:

MOSES E. FLEMING & CO. Among the leading book and job printing offices of Delaware; is that owned and operated by Nose E. Fleming & Co., which business was commenced in 1876, by George H. Thomson In 1877, the firm was changed to Thomson & Co., with Mr. Moses E. Fleming forming the "Co." Mr. Fleming was born in Radnor Township, Delaware Co., in 1853, and is the son of Joseph D. Fleming, whose father was one of the pioneer settlers of Delaware Co.; Mr. Fleming remained on the farm until 1870, when he entered the Gazette office and learned the printer's trade; in 1877, he entered his present business, and, in 1878, the firm of Moses E. Fleming & Co. was formed, the "Co." being H. J. McCullough, a leading citizen of Delaware; since then, they have been engaged in doing a large book and job printing business, also as book-binders, all work being done in the best and latest style; they occupy two rooms in the block on the northwest

corner of Main and Sandusky streets, and have in operation three first-class presses, one cylinder and two job presses, with steam power, turning out the best work in the city, doing the greater part of the printing for Donovan's Original Tennesseans and for the Delaware Chair Co., and part of the work on the Ohio Wesleyan University Catalogue, and other establishments of Delaware and its vicinity.
